Chimerical – Liz Lescault

Defintions:

“A hope or dream that is extremely unlikely to ever come true.”

“An organism that contains cells or tissues from two or more genetically different life forms.”

In “Chimerical” my biomorphic sculptures evoke beings that exist only in my mind’s eye. My sculptures combine elements from all forms and stages of life, active and inert, living and dead, combining attributes and impressions into new visions. The sculptures will seem familiar but are not representations of anything that exists in the real world. I draw my inspiration from elemental forms found in nature, freely combining elements from nature, using imagery from the ocean depths, the detritus of the forest floor, geologic formations and microscopic life. The intent is to create work that can be simultaneously sensual and scientific. My art is improvisational. I begin with the seed of an idea, following the evolving piece where-ever it leads me. The end result is often a surprise to me. In the creation of my work I employ ceramic media, stoneware clay, mixed media and found materials. Some of the works on exhibit are created primarily with clay and others are created from other media including plastic, polymer and spun glass.
